Letter of Agreement

Watersmeet Education Association

And

Watersmeet Township Schools Board of Education

Re: Master Agreement Placement of Non-Certified Teaching Personnel

The Association and the District are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) covering the 2022-23 school years and need to amend the required provisions of that Agreement in order to hire non-certified instructional employees under the collective bargaining agreement/Master Agreement.

The Watersmeet Township School District and Watersmeet Education Association agree to amend the Master Agreement of said Agreement covering years 2022-2023 as herein provided;

- The parties agree to permanently modify Article 1 Recognition, subsection A and C as follows:
 - A. The Board hereby recognizes the Association as the exclusive bargaining representative, as defined in Section II of Act 379, Public Acts of 1965, for all full-time and part-time certified teaching personnel, including the guidance counselor, as well as non-certified/permitted teachers as defined herein, employed by the Board, but excluding supervisory and executive personnel. The term teacher represented by the Association in the bargaining of negotiation unit as defined above, and references to male teachers shall include female teachers.
 - B. Non-certified/permitted teachers shall be defined as teachers who are hired by the district to fill a vacated position in the bargaining unit. The term does not apply to individuals hired as daily substitutes to cover in the absence of a regularly schedule certified or non-certified/permitted teacher.
- The parties agree that non-certified instructional employees shall be hired, placed, and remain on Step 0 of the Master Agreement until they receive their Michigan certification. All other contractual benefits shall be granted.

- 3. The parties agree that initial permitting/renewal permitting paperwork for non-certified instructional employees is the responsibility of the administration of the Watersmeet Township School District. Non-certified/Permitted teachers shall cooperate with the district in providing information necessary to obtain proper permitting. Non-certified/Permitted teachers shall be held harmless from loss of pay/benefits for District's failure to seek proper permitting.
- 4. The parties agree that the contract shall be updated upon signing of this Letter of Agreement to reflect changes in non-medical benefits as indicated in MESSA Quote ID: 351266. This change shall replace current benefit levels and remain until altered through the collective bargaining process.
- 5. The parties agree that this letter of agreement shall be incorporated with, and become a permanent part of, the current collective bargaining agreement, and shall not terminate upon expiration of the current collective bargaining agreement.

A regular meeting of the board of education of the District (the "Board") was held in the Watersmeet Twp School Library, within the boundaries of the District, on the 26th day of June, 2023, at 4:07 o'clock in the A.m. (the "Meeting").

The Meeting was called to order by Michelle Hazen, President.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member T. Pallin and supported by Member T. Williams:

WHEREAS:

- 1. The District's bond issue dated November 21, 2006, designated "2006 Refunding Bonds (General Obligation Unlimited Tax)" (the "2006 Bonds"), was retired and paid in full on or about November 28, 2022; and
- 2. There is remaining in the 2006 Bond Debt Retirement Fund (the "2006 Debt Fund") the surplus balance of approximately \$243,180.47, including interest earned to the date of transfer; and
- 3. Section 701 of the Revised Municipal Finance Act (MCL 141.2701), Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, provides that "[m]oney remaining in a debt retirement fund from the levy of a tax or an account within a debt retirement fund from the levy of a tax after the retirement of all municipal securities payable from that fund shall be used in the following order of priority: (a) to pay other outstanding unlimited tax full faith and credit municipal securities; (b) to pay other outstanding limited tax full faith and credit municipal securities; and (c) to be deposited in the general fund of the municipality"; and
- 4. Because the District has no outstanding unlimited tax full faith and credit municipal securities or limited tax full faith and credit municipal securities, the Board desires to have this remaining sum in the 2006 Debt Fund, together with delinquent taxes receivable, transferred to the District's General Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Superintendent or Business Manager, or a designee thereof, is hereby authorized to take all necessary actions to transfer approximately \$243,180.47 (together with interest earned, if any, from the date hereof to the date of transfer) from the District's 2006 Debt Fund to the District's General Fund, pursuant to Section 701 of the Revised Municipal Finance Act, as amended.
- 2. Once the above-described transfer of funds has been accomplished, the Superintendent or Business Manager, or a designee thereof, is authorized to close the 2006 Debt Fund.
